Out in the garden

Honey bees need plenty of pollen and nectar from all sorts of flowers to support the growing hive in summer and enough to build food reserves for the winter.

What honey bees also need is a dependable source of water all year round, like all animals.

Water is used for various reasons. Crystallized honey can be dissolved in winter. Spread droplets can help cool down the brood comb in summer to help create the right temperature for raising baby bees.

The best sources are the one's that aren't shared by other livestock, pets or humans (swimming pools) and which are safe for bees and which won't go dry in summer.


Biologists believe bees find their water by scent rather than sight.

A water source that smells like wet earth, moss, worms, decomposition and even chlorine is very appealing to bees.

As already mentioned bees like a safe place to stand to prevent drowning. A saucer filled with marbles or stones, a bucket of water with plenty of "bee rafts" such as cork, sticks, sponges or cloth works well

As with Humans, bees are creatures of habit. A bad habit is hard to break, so it pays to establish a regular and safe water supply early.

If bees have created the bad habit of using the pool, horse trough, pinned up laundry for their water supply. Try a handful of ground oyster shells added to the bowl. This gives the water a faintly salty smell, bees find that attractive. Alternatively you can also use a weak sugar solution to lure them to the new water source until the good habit is established.







End of October, early November is traditional Sweetcorn planting time. Seed is available, here at Kiwi Seed

Have you tried our Spelt Husk? It's back in store again.

Husk can be used in a variety of ways, e.g. for bedding (small animals like rabbits or guinea pigs), in the chicken coop or as garden mulch.

In the 11th Century, medical writer Hildegard von Bingen pointed out that spelt husk has a high silica content, which is very beneficial for the body and general well – being.

Spelt pillows are lightweight, breathable and retain heat well, because they contain only the husks. Husks are free flowing and adapt perfectly to the shape of the body.

Christmas is coming up very soon, why not treat your dog with a homemade spelt husk bed this year?

Take a clean jute sack (available at Kiwi Seed) and fill with husk to volume required, sow up the top. Job done.
